Illinois Invents is an Illinois not-for-profit company in the education enhancement space. Following a successful model from other states, Illinois Invents is bringing the Invention Convention to Illinois. This program allows students to embrace their creativity, learn research and problem solving skills, and enhance presentation skills. The top students then progress to the regional competition where they can earn scholarships and the right to represent Illinois at the national competition.
